From February 1964 to February 1967 I travelled overland from Singapore to Europe and UK, returning a similar route through the Middle East and South East Asia and staying with local people along the way. I arrived in Darwin in 1967, and returned in June, 1969, where I lived until June 1985, assisting Aboriginal groups with their land rights claims, as described in my book (see above). I returned to Darwin in 1996 for 18 months of field work camping with homeless Burarra people from Maningrida, Arnhem Land. During my research I travelled to Maningrida three times, twice by road. In 2001 I participated in the making of the Darwin film, *We live in the long grass* (Mousetrap Films).
