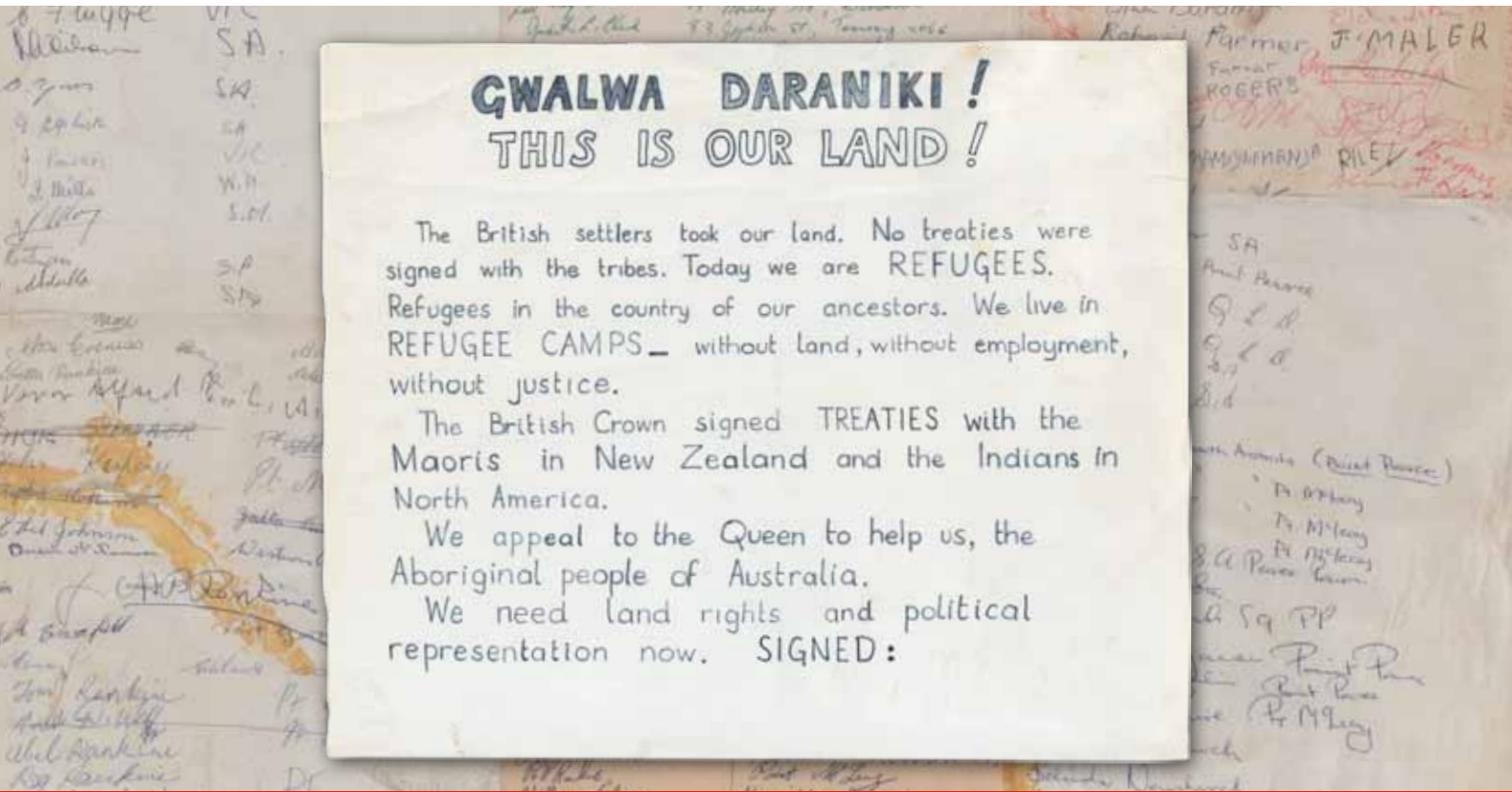
Petition to HM The Queen from the Larakia/Larrakia people regarding land rights presented to HRH The Princess Margaret (detail), 1972.
