

All people interested in the future of Kulaluk and those people who live there are invited to attend the annual general meeting of the Gwalwa Daraniki Association at Kulaluk off Dick Ward Drive tomorrow, October 30 at 9.30am.

The publication Bunji and a spokesman for Kulaluk community said the meeting will discuss and decide on matters of vital interest to the people of the north and Darwin in particular.

The spokesman said that Mayor Cecil Black claimed on TV that he would force all Aboriginal people camping in the Darwin area to live at Kulaluk.

"Mr Black," said the spokesman, "plans to turn Kulaluk into another Kahlin Compound which was once known as a kind of 'concentration camp'."

The speaker and Bunji warned that if Mayor Black wants trouble then he could be sure of getting it.

The meeting is certain to discuss private plans to dig up the creek and destroy the Kulmarini camp mangrove area.

It will also certainly hear critical and important matters contained in the Woodward Commission "Report on Land Rights."

The spokesman said also that the decisions of the meeting would be important to all people of goodwill in Darwin who wished to see justice administered to all sections of the community.
