



The Northern Land Council had a meeting a t croker Island on 17th and 18th September. John Crosby spoke for Kulaluk. Twenty six brothers and sisters came to talk about land claims.

Palmerston FREEWAY

Everyone voted against the big highway going across Kulaluk.

COX PENINSULAR

The Northern Land Council wants the whole of Cox Peninsular to be re.turned to the Aborigines.

RAAF BOMBS

The twenty six representatives all agreed with Harry Singh "No more bombs on our islands".

RED MUD AT YIRRKALA.

T he Yirrkala people did not send anyone to the meeting (Yirrkala 1 is the camp on the edge of Nhulunboy mining town). Someone heard that the Red mud from the mine was making the people sick.

URANIUM

The meeting was worried that the Uranium mining company was not taking any noyice at all of the WOOD-WARD report. "They must talk with us" said the Northern Land Council.

RANGERS

Har ry Singh said "The Wagaits want black rangers to protect the birds animals , fish and trees on our lands.

Some people say that it might be better for the NLC to train the tribes to use rifles because no-one takes any notice at all of any of these resolutions. Sad, but true; the twenty six brothers and sisters at the meeting were talking to themselves !

"EQUAL WITH CRIMINALS


Fred Fogarty has been in jail for two months. He is to be released in early March 1975. He says 'Thankyou for all the latters.' Flease keep writing to P.O. Box 1.07 Darwin. Here is part of Fred8s letter to Bunji.

"Being in jail is proving to be a great experience. I predict that in the distant future Aborigines will be treated equal to criminals. .. will be a day to look forward to. From that position, with a bit of coaching we will then elevate to the slums - not in my time....

The pictures over the weekend were beauties again - 'Where Eagles Dare'. It started slow then the action really warmed up. Clint Eastwood for America and Richard Burton for England wiped out the whole German race. Dead whites everywhere. Burton suffered a corn on his trigger finger and. Eastwood a scratch on his hand.

I was going to ask about a course in education here in the hope that I may become as elever as the whiteman, but the prisoners here tell me that it takes months toget anything like that So I borrowed a book, Guiness Book of World Records. It told me a bit about the Atom Bomb which is out of style. Then about the hydrogen, also out of fashion. The in thing now is the M bomb. According to this educational book, if anyone lets this little beauty go the only way to live is deep inside the ground for five years (I wonder if that book can be right as it is a 1970 edition). Here..is part of a seven page letter written to BU::JI by a man who has never had anything to do with Aboriginal affairs but just went along to see the trial of Fred Fogarty from August 19th to the 23rd.

Dear BUNJI.

I just would like to make a few comments on Fred Fogarty's trial. I had the opportunity to follow the trial from beginning to end. As you mention in your paper, the majority of people who were in the court from beginning to end were convinced Fred Fogarty must be aquited.

Of course the supreme judge objected to Mr Galballys description of all the evidence as "a heap of junk" but that is the appropriate description in English for such prepared rubbish.

And as you said , the jury talked about it over lunch and came straight back. One would imagine it would take at least four hours because the trial necessitated five days. The jurys mind was made up long before they made their verdict.

And I tell you why, because the facts which were presented to the jury shot through the rectum of their corrupted body without digestion.

I believe that there is enough land here in Australia for the Aborigines long and overdue need but there is certainly not enough for the so called civilized mans greed.

I would also like to confirm that Fred Fogarty is a real prisoner of war. He is also a hero in my book.

I conclude my letter by predicting that the Aborigines will win in the end because on a fundar moral level, Alena, but it magnetic in not cease to exist for the benefit of the white man.
