- Admitted to practise in 1970 after studying at University of Adelaide. Appointed assistant crown prosecutor in SA in 1974 and senior crown prosecutor in 1982.
- Appointed Queen's Counsel in 1984 and in 1991 became senior counsel assisting the royal commission into WA Inc.

  Appointed Commonwealth Director of Public Prosecutions in 1997, holding the position until appointed to the SA Supreme

Court in 1999.

- Chief Justice of the NT Supreme Court from 2004 until his retirement from the position in August last year. Became an additional judge of the court in November last year.
- Presided over the "bodies-in-barrels"
  Snowtown case in SA in 2002 and 2003 in which John Justin Bunting was found guilty of 11 murders and Robert Joe Wagner guilty of seven killings.

- sparked community outrage in 2004 when he handed a one-month jail sentence to a 55-year-old man who raped a 14-year-old girl who was promised to him as a wife under customary law when she was four.
- Presided over the infamous 2005 trial of outback killer Bradley John Murdoch, who murdered British backpacker Peter Falconio on a remote stretch of highway north of Alice Springs in 2001. The jury delivered a unanimous verdict and Mr Martin sentenced Murdoch to life with a minimum of 28 years.

  until 2001 and made
  a club ambassador in
  2004.
- Made an Officer of the Order of Australia in the Queen's Birthday Honours this year.
