While fail is not good for indigenous Yustralians child sexual assault is a crime no matter what the cultural context

With one in four girls and one in six boxs subjected to sexual assault, the challenge for men who abuse and for judges who condone the abuse is to respect the integrity and rights a children and young people.

There are good examples of community levelopment programs in many transitional communities that challenge and change community values and practises that are harmful to children
